Making a Christmas Bubble

When following the new rules for these five days, we must continue to take personal responsibility to limit the spread of the virus and protect our loved ones, particularly if they are vulnerable.

For many, it will mean that it isn't possible to celebrate Christmas in the way you normally would.

Between 23rd and 27th December;

You can form an exclusive bubble composed of people from no more than three households.

Scenario 1

Three households mixing exclusively as a Christmas Bubble
during the 23rd-27th December.



Scenario 2



Household 1



Household 2

Two households mix exclusively as a Christmas Bubble
over the period 23rd-27th December.



Scenario 3



Household 1, household 2 and household 3 meet as a Christmas Bubble on 23rd
– 25th December.



Household 3 then meet with Household 4 on the
26th and 27th December.



Scenario 4



Household 1, household 2, household 3 and household 4 mix exclusively over the period 23rd December to 27th December.



- Once you have formed a Christmas Bubble, you cannot change your bubble.
- You cannot be in more than one Christmas Bubble during the period of 23rd -27th December.
- You can only meet people in your Christmas Bubble in your home or private garden/yard.
- If you have to travel to be with your Christmas Bubble, you should be back in your home by 27th December.
- The Christmas Bubble Restrictions only apply to people meeting in your home and private garden/yard. You can continue to meet people out of your Christmas Bubble outdoors in public places in groups of no more than 6 (including children of all ages).
- If you are self-isolating or someone in your household has tested positive, you cannot form a Christmas Bubble.

The rules on forming and using a Christmas Bubble are UK law. You must follow them to minimise the spread of infection.

Forming a Christmas Bubble if you are already in a support bubble

- Existing support bubbles count as one household towards the three household limit. This only applies to support bubbles as set out in law.



Household 1 and 2 are in a support bubble as household 1 is a single parent with children under the age of 18.

Support Bubble/Household1, Household 2 and Household 3 meet exclusively as a Christmas Bubble over the period 23rd-27th December.



Childcare

Between 23rd and 27th December, you can continue to use a childcare bubble, but only if reasonably necessary for the purpose of childcare and where there are no reasonable alternatives. If you want to meet socially with the other household in your childcare bubble then they should be included in your Christmas Bubble.

You and the other household in your childcare bubble would count as two households towards the three household limit for Christmas Bubbles.

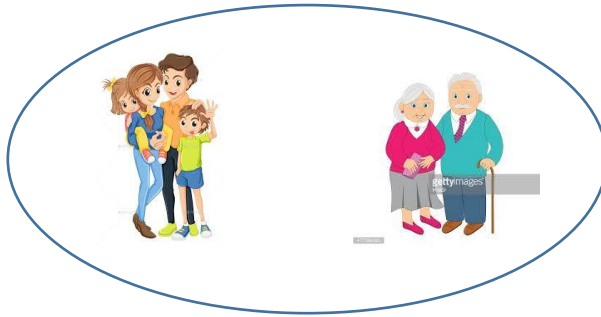
Children from Household 1 are in a childcare bubble with household 2



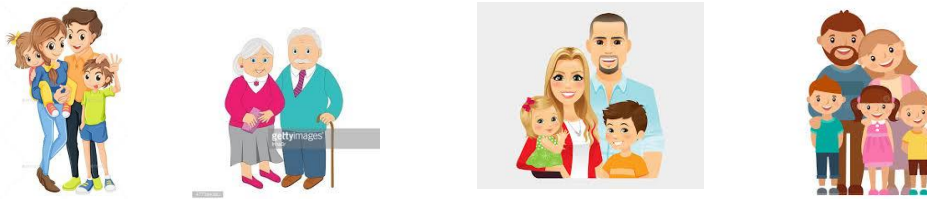
The whole family in household 1, the childcarers in household 2 and household 3 form an exclusive Christmas Bubble for the period of 23rd December- 27th December.



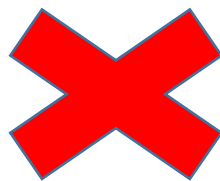
Scenario 2



Children from Household 1 are in a childcare bubble with household 2



The whole family in household 1, the child carers in household 2, household 3 and household 4 form an exclusive Christmas Bubble for the period of 23rd December- 27th December.



Separated parents

Children (under the age of 18) whose parents do not live together may be part of both parents' Christmas Bubbles, if their parents choose to form separate bubbles. Nobody else should be in two bubbles.
